# Policy – SFS Code of Conduct

Overview	
Introduction	This policy sets out the code of conduct expected by SFS.
Target Audience	Members, guests, volunteers and staff of SFS
Purpose	This code has been developed to assist club members to promote active participation in sailing and social activities within a safe and enjoyable environment. This code applies to all members and their guests.

#### Behaviour of Members in the club

Introduction	This covers the behaviour of members within club premises, or while representi the club	
General behaviour	Members must not engage in conduct that will reflect adversely on the club or sailing generally. Members, guests and volunteers must behave in an approp professional and sportsmanlike manner whilst sailing and in the club, and at times when representing the club.	
Dress	Members must dress appropriately and abide by the By-laws as set out from time to time.	
Smoking	Members must not smoke on the premises, except in designated smoking areas.	
Children	Members must ensure that all children are supervised at all times and ensure no guests under the age of eighteen (18) years are allowed to use poker machines or be supplied liquor on the premises.	
Responsibility for visitors	Members will be solely responsible for all guests they introduce to club premises, including correct signing in, their conduct and compliance with the code of conduct and departure at the same time (or earlier than) as the member.	
Cooperation with Management	Members are to cooperate and follow directions from club officials and management at all times.	
Use of facilities	Members must use facilities and equipment for their proper purposes, and in compliance with any lease, licensing laws, neighbourhood agreements and terms issued by the management. They must, at all times, protect and preserve the premises, grounds, facilities and assets of the club, and keep them as clean and tidy as possible.	

### **Members** actions

Introduction	This section covers the interaction between members and other people.	
General	Members must refrain from abuse, intimidation and/or harassment of others.	
Discrimination and villification	Members must not engage in discriminatory behaviour, including public disparagement of, discrimination against, or vilification of, a person on account of an attribute (for example race, (including colour, nationality and national or ethnic origin), sex (including pregnancy), marital status, disability, homosexuality, transgender, carer's responsibility).	
Independence	Members have a duty to make decisions solely on merit and in the club's and the sport's interests. Members must not act in order to gain financial or other benefit for self, family, friends or business interests, nor use the club or sport as a means of pursuing personal grievances with other members and their guests.
